Watering Schedule

As we enter drought season it is important to follow the watering schedule provided by the Sacramento County Water Agency.

The Permitted Irrigation Time of Day is from 8 pm - 8 am. See below for the days you can water.



Sprinkler (lawn) & Drip (trees, shrubs): Wednesday, Friday, Sunday

Address Ending in Odd Number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9)

Sprinkler (lawn) & Drip (trees, shrubs): Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday



Pool Monitors

The Pool Monitor is responsible for opening and closing pool area(s), maintaining a clean/organized surrounding, monitoring member/guest access and behavior, and offering fair/consistent enforcement of community rules.

Lakeside Assessments are due July 1st. If you have Autopay, please remember to go online and update the amount being deducted to match the new quarterly amounts.

Pool Rules

As we enter into the 2021 pool season we'd like to remind members of the pool rules to help ensure a safe experience for everyone.

- Furniture is spaced out based on capacity and social distancing requirements, please do not move furniture without talking to Staff.
- The use of inflatable floats is prohibited. Minors who are unable to swim may use water wings with an adult's supervision.
- Minors who are not toilet trained must wear swim diapers, traditional diapers are not permitted in the pools.
- No running, ball playing, pushing, dunking, dangerous games permitted.
- No diving is permitted.
- All swimmers must wear swimming attire.

Pear Tree Removal Project

As many of you know, our beautiful pear trees are infected with a destructive bacterial disease called Fire Blight.

This common and aggressive disease enters the tree at the tips of the branches and then travels down the stems causing dieback. Once trees get fire/pear blight they become weakened, settle into decline where they begin to decay. It can be difficult if not impossible to control the disease.

The Board was advised by our Association Arborist, that **trying to care for trees that are infected by fire/pear blight is very expensive**. In addition to pear blight, an ever-expanding root system outgrowing their installed location, codominant stems with included bark and high chance of limb failure are the main reasons that these pear trees no longer serve a purpose in the Lakeside HOA community and get to be replaced with higher quality trees.

We made the tough decision to remove 59 out of the 300 pear trees the Association maintains. These 59 trees are on the Northside and will be replaced with Sunshine Elms, October Glory Maples, and Chinese Pistache trees.

SAFETY TIPS & REMINDERS

Fireworks Safety Tips

In Elk Grove, we lose at least 1 home per year to the improper disposal of fireworks or the use of illegal fireworks. If you plan to use fireworks this Fourth of July, here are some important safety tips.

- Never allow young children to handle fireworks
- Older children should use them only under close adult supervision
- Never use fireworks while impaired by drugs or alcohol
- · Anyone using fireworks or standing nearby should wear protective eyewear
- Never hold lighted fireworks in your hands
- Never light them indoors
- Only use them away from people, houses and flammable material
- Never point or throw fireworks at another person
- Only light one device at a time and maintain a safe distance after lighting
- Never ignite devices in a container
- Do not try to re-light or handle malfunctioning fireworks
- Soak both spent and unused fireworks in water for a few hours before discarding
- Keep a bucket of water nearby to fully extinguish fireworks that don't go off or in case of fire
- Never use illegal fireworks

Do Not Leave Dogs in Cars

Every year, dogs suffer and die when their guardians make the mistake of leaving them in a parked car.

Parked cars are death traps for dogs. On a 90-degree day, the interior temperature of a vehicle can reach as high as 109 degrees in just 10 minutes. If you see a dog alone in a hot car, call local animal authorities or police and keep an eye on the dog.
